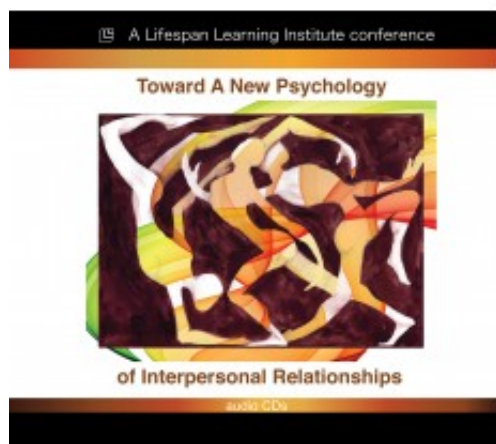


Toward A New Psychology of Interpersonal Relationships
